Open In-Hand Classes

For Classes 1 through 11, young horses are shown in hand on the triangle at the walk and trot. Bridles are optional on yearlings and younger animals, but mandatory on all 2 year olds and older whether being judged or not. Scoring will be weighted 60% Movement, 30% Conformation, 10% General Impression.

128. Colt/Gelding 2 Year Olds

130. Colt/Gelding Championship – Open to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places in classes 126-129 (Great American Insurance Group /USDFBC Qualifier)
131. Young Horse Championship – Open to Champion and Reserve from classes 125 and 130.

Mature Horses/Breeding Stock: For classes 132 through 136, mature horses are shown in hand on the triangle at the walk and trot. Bridles are mandatory. Scoring will be weighted 50% Movement, 40% Conformation, 10% General Impression.

132. Broodmares, 4 Years and Older (with or without foals) mare only judged
133. Maiden/Yeld Mares 4 years and Older
134. Mare Championship – Open to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places in classes 132 and 133 (Great American Insurance Group /USDFBC Qualifier)
135. Stallions, 4 Years and Older (shown only in-hand at this show)
136. Stallions, 4 Years and Older (shown in hand and under saddle at this show)
137. Stallion Championship – Open to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places in classes 135 and 136 (Great American Insurance Group /USDFBC Qualifier)
138. Mature Horse Championship – Open to Champion and Reserve from classes 134 and 137.
139. Grand Championship – Open to Champion and Reserve in classes 131 and 138.

GAIG/USDFBC: Champions and Reserve Champions (and 3<sup>rd</sup> placing horses if Champion and Reserve have qualified previously) from these classes qualify for the 2010 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeder's Championship Finals – New England Series.

Group Classes

For classes 140 through 142, horses are shown in hand on the triangle at the walk and trot. Judging to be weighted 50% Movement, 40% Conformation, 10% General Impression. Must submit a separate entry in the name of Dam, Sire or Breeder.

140. Produce of Dam (with or without dam) produce only judged, 2 or 3 of her produce. Entry must be made by the owner of the dam or with written permission from the owner, in the name of that Dam. All offspring entered must be named on the entry form. Multiple ownership is permitted and all owners must be listed.
141. Get of Sire (without Sire) 2 or 3 of his get. Entry must be made by the owner of the sire or with written permission from the owner, in the name of that Sire. All offspring entered must be named on the entry form. Multiple ownership is permitted and all owners must be listed.
142. Breeder's Group – a group of 2 or 3 horses, of any age or sex, all bred by the exhibitor and entered under the exhibitor's name.
143. Amateur Handler—Open to any amateur handler.  
Horses shall be shown in-hand on the triangle at the walk and trot. Horses must be owned by the handler or a member of the handler's family - no leased or borrowed horses allowed. To be judged on presentation and condition of animal and the neatness and appearance of the handler. Conformation will not be a determining factor, but may count 15%. Classes are intended to stimulate participation of the amateur in breeding divisions, but does not limit amateurs to this class. No colts or stallions except for weanlings.

#### Materiale Classes

Entries must be at least 36 months old to compete.

For classes 144 through 147, entries are ridden at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Judging to be weighted 30% Walk, 30% Trot, 30% Canter, and 10% General Impression (including balance, impulsion, and rideability)

144. 3 Year Old Fillies
145. 3 Year Old Colts/Geldings
146. 4 and 5 Year Old Mares
147. 4 and 5 Year Old Stallion/Geldings
148. Championship Materiale – Open to the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places in classes 144-148.

#### Individual Breed Classes (IBC)

Open to horses of any age. Classes will be broken into breed-specific subgroups based on the number of entries by breed. Breed specific classes and/or futurities are dependent upon number of entries. Refunds will be made if class is not held.

### General Information

**GAIG/USDF QUALIFYING** - GAIG/USDF Qualifying Classes, rider and owner must be a USEF member (Junior, Senior or Life); horse must be lifetime registered/recorded with USDF and USEF, rider must be an USDF participating member, and owner must be a USDF participating or business member.

**FREESTYLE CLASSES** – Copy of your qualifying test score must be included with entry.

**OPPORTUNITY CLASSES** – Classes 1b, 5b, 32b, 35b -- no memberships or federation fees required for participant or horse unless riding in other recognized classes.

**AWARDS** - First place prize awarded and ribbons to 6th place. Championship and Reserve Championship will be awarded at each level.

**FOOTING AND ARENAS** - Competition arenas are sand, warm up area is on sand/rubber mix. Training Level tests may be ridden in a small arena; all other tests will be ridden in a large arena.

### ENTRIES & CLASS FEES

- \$35.00 per class for Training Level through Fourth Levels; \$40.00 for FEI and Freestyle
- \$10.00 additional required for GAIG/USDF Qualifying classes
- \$20.00 Non-compete horse
- \$25.00 Late fee for entries not RECEIVED by the closing date
- \$20.00 Office Fee required; includes \$ 5.00 Refundable bridle number fee
- \$15.00 Federation Fee with each entry (Drugs & Meds \$7/USEF fee \$8)
- \$30.00 USEF non-members for EACH rider, owner, trainer (& coach if applicable)
- \$20.00 USDF non-member fee for both owner/lessor and rider
- \$ 5.00 USDF non-member card affidavit (or send a copy of your USDF NM Card!)
- \$ 3.00 Credit Cards Processing Fee (non-electronic entries only)

- **USDF Horse ID** or Horse Lifetime Registration number is required. Include copies of your USDF Horse Registration or HID card. If you do not have a USDF HID or Registration, you will be required to buy either a USDF Lifetime Horse ID (\$20 fee) or Lifetime Horse Registration (\$85 fee). If you have a USDF HID or Lifetime Registration number but cannot provide proof, you will be required to fill out a USDF affidavit and pay an additional \$5.00 fee before you are allowed to compete.
- **Entries will not be accepted without** a copy of 2008/2011 Negative Coggins Test and a copy of a Rabies certificate (signed by a veterinarian, valid within one year of competition date). For rider, owner, trainer, (& coach if applicable), and horse include copies of your USEF membership cards, proof of USDF membership or nonmember ID, USDF Horse ID/Registration, and if GAIG/USDF Qualifying, USEF Lifetime Horse Recording, a completed and signed entry form, and all fees. Incomplete entries or those requiring membership lookups will be charged a \$5.00 penalty fee.
- Refunds will be given for cancellations received in writing before the closing date less a \$15.00 office fee. If for any reason a class(es) or an entire day(s) needs to be canceled due to an act of God, national tragedy, or any other reason, no refunds will be made. Refunds after Closing Date ONLY with documented proof from a Medical or Veterinary doctor showing cause as to why the competitor should be excused; \$15 Office fee will apply. Changes to entries after the Closing Date will be charged an additional \$10.00. Non-compete horses require a signed entry blank, current Coggins and rabies forms.
- Measurement of ponies will be by appointment only. Please contact manager before the show. Owner to pay all fees for vet & pony measurement certified TD.
- **MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE to: Cayuga Dressage & Combined Training, Inc. and mail with entry form to the Secretary.**
- **ELECTRONIC ENTRIES may be completed online at EquestrianEntries.com.** There is no charge for this service although there is a 5% credit card fee if you pay by credit card. Follow online instructions.
- **POST ENTRIES** will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis if space is available. Classes entered after the closing date will cost an additional \$10.00 per class. Class changes after the closing date will cost \$10.00 per change.
- **TIMES & ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS** Tentative times may be obtained via the Internet: <http://www.cayugadressage.org>. Times will be available 3 days before the show. If you do not have access to the Internet, contact the Show Secretary to obtain your times (leave a message and your call will be returned).
- **MANAGEMENT NOTES:** Management reserves the right to combine or cancel classes, if entries warrant. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- **STABLING** - Permanent wooden stalls with full doors are available on the grounds after noon on Friday for \$40.00 per day or \$70.00 for the 2-night weekend; \$100 for 3-night weekend. Bedding is not provided but will be available to buy. Tack stalls same (subject to availability). Show horses have stabling preference over non-compete horses. #### **MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT**

**Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4)**

**classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. Federation Rule GR301.5 states: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license.
