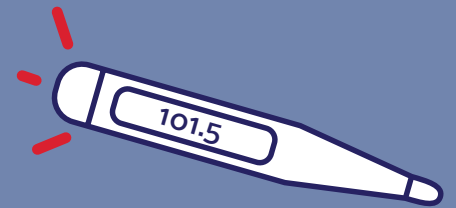
TOP TIPS

FOR KEEPING YOUR HORSE HEALTHY

1 Avoid direct horse-to-horse contact



2 Monitor your horse for clinical signs of disease & report a temperature over 101.5°F to a veterinarian.



3 Avoid non-essential people touching horses



4 Avoid sharing equipment unless it is thoroughly cleaned & disinfected between uses.



5 Avoid use of communal water sources.

*Appropriate tests may be ridden as a second Qualifying opportunity each day for GAIG/USDF Regional Championships; however, only **one** Qualifying score may be earned per competition. **USDF 1st through 4th Level MFS may be ridden for GAIG/USDF Qualifier. ***YH TOC includes USEF 4 YO or FEI 5 YO or 6 YO tests.

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Notes: Test Of Choice (TOC) classes please specify test on entry.

Management reserves the right to combine, divide or cancel any classes as entries warrant. Competitors needing to ride under two judges should plan to compete in both shows, Saturday and Sunday. Management cannot consider requests for scheduling of judges from competitors.

Opportunity Classes: Per USEF Rule GR821, dressage classes can be offered as “Opportunity” classes at recognized dressage competitions. Horses and riders participating in “Opportunity” classes are exempt from Federation and affiliate organization membership and Horse Identification (HID) requirements and non-member fees. Horses and/or riders entered in “Opportunity” classes may cross enter into the Open classes, however all applicable fees and membership requirement will apply.

Freestyle Requirements: Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a Federation /USDF Licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or “open” Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. To enter an FEI Para Dressage Freestyle class, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in any FEI Para Dressage test (Para Novice Test, Para Intermediate Test or Para Grand Prix Test) at the rider’s classified Grade. This score may be earned at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or “open” Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. All FEI Pony Rider Tests are equivalent to Second Level; all FEI Junior Tests are equivalent to Third Level; all FEI Young Rider Tests are equivalent to PSG; and the USEF Brentina Cup (Young Adult) Test and FEI Young Rider Grand Prix 16-25 Tests are equivalent to Intermediate II. For purposes of freestyle qualification, all are considered equivalent to the highest test of that level and may be used to enter a freestyle at that level or a level below. Young Horse and FEI Children Tests cannot be used for freestyle qualification at any level.

LEVELS: USDF Introductory Level through Grand Prix. Training Level through FEI Freestyles. Dressage Seat Equitation. Opportunity Classes – Introductory, Training Level and Eventing Dressage. Para-Equestrian and Young Horse.

AWARDS: Six ribbons in each class. Introductory through Second Level tests will be split AA, Open, and Jr/YR unless management deems such a division to be unmerited by low entries in any way. Competitors agree to abide by the system of placing set in place by show management for individual classes, as this may change from class to class based on entries. See website www.cayugadressage.org for special awards for riders, ages, and breeds to be presented at our Saturday evening Wine and Cheese Gala and Awards Ceremony following the competition on Saturday. You **MUST** be present at the awards ceremony to win your special award; awards will not be shipped.

NATIONAL DRESSAGE PONY CUP PARTNER SHOW:

This is an official Partner Show with The National Dressage Pony Cup (NDPC). An NDPC ribbon will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion of the Pony Test of Choice Class and Small Horse Test of Choice Class each day. A small horse measurement form must be filled out prior to competing (form provided below). For more info, visit www.dressageponycup.com.



PONY MEASUREMENT: Per DR135, any pony being ridden in a class restricted to ponies must possess a Federation Standard or Temporary Dressage Pony measurement card. (A current, valid USEF Driving or Hunter/Jumper measurement card may also be acceptable as long as it is otherwise valid according to Dressage measurement requirements.) Owners must notify management of any ponies needing a measurement at least five days prior to the start of competition, so management can arrange a time for the veterinarian to be on grounds for this service. The measurement fee will be the actual charge by the veterinarian, prorated among the pony owners, and will not exceed \$100 per pony. Annual measurement may be required for any pony under 8 years old which does not have a Standard Certificate of Measurement. Pony riders will be notified by email of times and location for measurement prior to competition.

UNITED STATES PONY CLUB HIGH POINT PROGRAM:

Current child and adult USPC members are eligible for special ribbons thanks to the USPC High Point Program which recognizes USPC members as ambassadors at shows or events outside of USPC. Ribbons to be awarded from Introductory through Fourth Level. Please include your USPC member number with your entry.

Separate entry forms are required for Competitions #4285 (Saturday) and #336698 (Sunday). All entries must include three signatures (Owner/Rider/Trainer) and emergency contact information on the USEF Entry Agreement (DO NOT WRITE "SAME" OR TYPE YOUR SIGNATURE) and signed USEF Waiver Agreements for each person.

- USEF/Drug Fee for each competition (Opportunity-ONLY entries are exempt).
- Proof of negative Coggins test and rabies vaccination within 12 months of the show date.
- Documentation of Flu (EIV) and Rhino (EHV) vaccination within 6 months of the show date.
- USEF and USDF documents for rider, owner, trainer and horse as appropriate for entry/classes. Master Verification for USEF and USDF can be obtained via www.EqVerification.org
- USDF non-member fee (\$55), if applicable.
- USEF memberships and Horse Recording **MUST** be completed prior to the competition. USEF Show Pass, if applicable, **MUST** be paid directly online and cannot be submitted by the show.

Please see the GAIG/USDF Regional Championships page for USEF and USDF Membership and Horse Recording requirements for Qualifying and Championships. All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the Championships. It is the responsibility of the competitor to submit required documents for national awards.

To be eligible to compete at Federation Licensed Competitions, coaches, trainers, and legal guardians signing as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing. Riders and owners are eligible for one (and **ONLY** one) Show Pass per year. Trainers and coaches are no longer eligible to participate under a Show Pass.

Online entries via Entry.FoxVillage.com. For hardcopy entries, make checks payable to CDCT, Inc. and mail to show secretary. Entries must be **RECEIVED** by the closing date. Late entries will be accepted if scheduling permits at the discretion of show management. Entries **WILL NOT** be accepted by voicemail, text message, Facebook, Messenger, or other social media.

Management may refuse any entry whose account is not in good standing by the start of the competition, and any competitor who has an outstanding bad check at the start of the competition will be required to pay in cash before showing.

Every horse MUST be registered with the show secretary PRIOR to arriving at the show grounds.

All horses will be assigned a bridle number that must be worn at all times when outside of the stall or trailer, even if they are a non-compete. Any unregistered horses will be asked to leave immediately and the associated party may be prohibited from entering future competitions. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

REFUND POLICY: Refunds, less office fees, will be given for cancellations received in writing or by email before the closing date. No refunds will be given after closing date.

Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, "acts of God," accident or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any qualifying classes being offered. **Entry fees and stall assignments are non-transferable and non-refundable after the closing date for any reason, including "acts of God" which require management to cancel classes or day(s) of competition.**

FACILITY VACCINATION RULE: All horses entering the Fairgrounds must have a negative Coggins test and proof of rabies vaccine within 12 months of the show date; and proof of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (EIV/EHV) vaccinations within 6 months of the show date.

SCORES: It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day during which the score was earned.

SCHEDULE, TIMES, NOTIFICATION: Unofficial ride times will be posted online (FoxVillage.com and CayugaDressage.org) approximately one week before the show and updated as needed. Times will become official by noon of the day before the show. Day sheets will be posted at the show for reference at all times. Competitors are responsible for checking updated ride times. Classes may not necessarily run in the order listed in the prize list.

STABLING: Stalls are available from noon Friday through 7 PM Sunday. Permanent stabling of 11x11' stalls with doors are available at \$130 per stall for the weekend. Shavings are available for pre-purchase for \$10 per bag with your entry. Extras to buy on-site are not guaranteed, so please plan accordingly. Stabling fees may not be split between entries. Please indicate stabling group requests on entry. Tack stalls are available for \$130 and are available on a first come basis, but are not guaranteed. We will do our best to accommodate all requests. Day stalls, if space permits, are \$85 per day. Late stabling requests (after the show closing date) will be assessed a \$10 fee per stall.

HORSE TRAILERS: Parking is available on the field near the entrance gate. Please do not park trailers on the ends of the barns or in front of the arenas unless temporarily loading or unloading. Horse trailers can be used in the campsite but no horses are allowed in that area.

CAMPING: Campsites are available on-site for \$60 per night and include electric hook-up. No horses are allowed in camping area. Any person sleeping anywhere on the show grounds is regarded as a camper regardless of electrical hookup. Per county regulations, you must maintain 10 feet between camp sites, including any awnings or slide outs.

DIRECTIONS:

From Ithaca: Take NY-13 N. Keep right onto Brickyard Lane. Turn left onto Grand Central Ave. Take the first entrance to the fairgrounds on the left. Follow the driveway straight and to the left to get to the show grounds.

From Elmira: From I-86 E, take exit 53 towards Horseheads. Turn right onto Grand Central Ave. Take the first entrance to the fairgrounds on the left. Follow the driveway straight and to the left to get to the show grounds.

From Binghamton: From I-86 W, take exit 54 onto NY-13 towards Horseheads. Keep left. Turn left onto Grand Central Ave. Take the first entrance to the fairgrounds on the left. Follow the driveway straight and to the left to get to the show grounds.

FOOTING: Two 20m x 60m (standard) competition arenas with sand footing. Opportunity, Introductory, Para Equestrian and Eventing tests may run in a 20m x 40m (small) arena with sand footing. Rubber footing warm-up ring and designated lunging area.

ENTERTAINMENT: Water will be available to competitors for the duration of the show. My Eva food truck will be on the grounds Saturday and Sunday. Our Wine and Cheese Gala and Special Awards Ceremony will take place on Saturday evening one hour after the final ride of the day and everyone is encouraged to attend!

HOLD HARMLESS CLAUSE: *Understanding that horse sports may be hazardous and dangerous, even leading to permanent injury or death, each owner, rider, spectator, and other participant assumes any and all risk of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless of negligent acts or omissions Cayuga Dressage and Combined Training, the show management, show committee, and all horse show personnel.*

OTHER INFORMATION: 1) A veterinarian will be on-call with contact information posted in the show office. A farrier will be on-site until noon each day and then on-call. 2) Appropriate ASTM/SEI helmets are required for all riders when mounted at any time on the show grounds. 3) All dogs must be leashed or confined while on the show grounds and must have proof of vaccination. 4) Bridle numbers must be worn on the horse at all times when a horse is out of the stall or trailer. 5) Horses may be ridden only by riders, trainers, coaches and owners who have signed the appropriate entry form and USEF Waiver.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

SHARPS CONTAINERS - GR1210.4: Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

SAFE SPORT TRAINING REMINDER: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. 2026 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2026 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).

A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual Recorded Farm/Business (with Senior Active Competing Farm Owner in good standing)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

USEF Membership Statement: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- or
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

To encourage the retraining of Thoroughbreds into other disciplines upon completion of careers in racing or breeding, The Jockey Club created the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.). T.I.P. has a number of programs geared toward all riders and Thoroughbreds. Generally, all information on T.I.P. programs can be found on our website (tjctip.com) under "TB Owners & Riders".

Eligibility - For purposes of eligibility for all T.I.P. classes and awards, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. Unregistered horses are not eligible.

T.I.P. Numbers - To participate in T.I.P., owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number. To apply for a T.I.P. number, please visit tjctip.com and click on "My Account". You will need an Interactive Registration™ account to apply for a T.I.P. Number. Interactive Registration™ is a FREE service designed for the use of thoroughbred owners and breeders to transact business electronically with The Jockey Club registry. T.I.P. Numbers are free. The T.I.P. number card should be provided to participating horse shows as proof of eligibility.

- T.I.P. Numbers are horse/owner specific. If you purchase a horse with a number, you need to get a new T.I.P. Number for the horse under your own account.
- All riders must be listed on the T.I.P. Number – to add a rider, log into your account and click "Add Rider"

Horse Show Awards – T.I.P. offers sponsorship of Thoroughbred classes and high point awards at approved horse shows in virtually all disciplines, including hunter/jumper, eventing, dressage, Western, polo, polocrosse, and endurance.

Performance Awards – The Performance Awards are T.I.P.'s year end, self-reported Thoroughbred "points program". The Performance Awards are completely self-reported by the Thoroughbred's owner or rider. The Award Year is December 1 - November 30 and all forms are due December 20.

Recreational Riding Program – The Thoroughbred Recreational Riding Incentive Program (TRRIP) is designed to recognize and reward Thoroughbred owners and riders that enjoy recreational riding or driving on a regular basis. There are prizes associated with each hour level, beginning with 25 hours.

Championships – The Jockey Club hosts an all Thoroughbred Championship Horse Show with championship divisions for Hunters, Jumpers, English Pleasure, Dressage and Western Pleasure. T.I.P. offers championship awards for eventing at the United States Eventing Association's American Eventing Championships.

Young Rider and Non-Competition Programs – T.I.P. offers a Young Rider of the Year Award and a Youth Ambassador Program as well as a Thoroughbred of the Year Award which recognizes a Thoroughbred that has excelled in a non-competitive career, such as equine-assisted therapy or police work.
