All non-USEF-licensed/non-USDF-recognized competitions are invited to participate in this program. To participate, simply submit the <u>online application</u> and \$25 participation fee to USDF at least 30 days prior to the start of the competition. The program year will be December 1 through November 30.

An online competition calendar will list participating competitions on the USDF website. Participating competitions must submit a copy of their prize list to USDF no later than 14 days prior to the competition and competition results must be submitted to USDF within 21 days of the end date of the competition.

Vincent Flores clinic, sponsored by Central NYDCTA April 10, 2021 Canterbury Stables, Cazenovia, NY By Carol Morris

Thanks to Lorrie Butcher, Dinah Guarino, Karen Steffy and Kathy Thode for sharing their notes.

It was great to be able to attend a clinic in person again. Canterbury is a great venue, and their food is always a treat! Many thanks to Canterbury for hosting, and to CNYDCTA for organizing. As I compile these notes, I realize that there really isn't anything new here, but Mr. Flores presented these ideas clearly, and the improvements were easily observable. I hope to be able to audit, if not ride with him again in the future, and I would recommend his clinics to riders of all levels.

Rider position:

- -Elbows slightly ahead of your waist.
- -Thumbs up.
- -Opening rein take it to the side, not up to encourage bend.
- -NEVER cross the rein over the wither.

Some definitions

- -Contact is hand on bit. Connection is the contact with the whole horse; how horse uses his back as a bridge, to bring the hind legs under. To allow the energy to flow.
- -When your horse is "active", he can do anything you ask without hesitation. Horse should be forward in "cruise control"; then your aids can ask for changes. You should not have to constantly ask for forward.
- -Rhythm means the footfalls: 4-beat walk, 2-beat trot, 3-beat canter.
- -Tempo is the pace number of footfalls/minute.
- -Throughness: when riding you should be able to put the frame wherever you want. If you can keep contact and do this, your horse is over the back and going to the bridle.

General training hints

- -In the warm-up the frame should be longer, but this may be different for a very hot horse.
- -Leg yield to supple the back in warm-up.
- -There is no bend in a leg yield.
- -Connection over the back comes first.
- -Horses have a stiff side b/c they are weaker in that hind leg. Spend 2/3 of your ride on the weaker side to strengthen it. You may have to ride each side completely differently.

If the horse breaks from canter to trot, immediately transition back up, even if the transition is ugly.

- -Transitions must be the rider's decision, not the horse's.
- -First round, then bend. Otherwise the horse may get twisted.
- -In a trot-walk transition, keep posting until the walk happens, so you keep the forward.
- -When the horse resists in front, close the leg. If he looks at something, use your inside leg. There is nothing scary on the inside of the circle.
- -Use the corners.
- -Sucking back in transition is the same as bracing the back.
- -On a circle you should see the inside eye. The smaller the circle, the greater the bend.

- -The inside rein is useless except for creating flexion.
- -Rein back is a diagonal movement.
- -There is no impulsion at the walk. There is a lot of impulsion at extended gaits and passage.
- -Forward does not mean rushing.
- -Rides should be fun. Never be in a rush. No pressure to accomplish something specific.
- -Don't fade in stride length in movement. Especially in lateral movements. Keep the same tempo.
- -Be very clear about different canters.
- -Horses only understand reward or correction.

Advanced work

- -Passage: first slow the trot, lighten the seat and more up in the frame
- -Slow down and increase up, elevate the energy into passage: like a rectangle of water getting squashed to a square: the level of water rises as the length of the rectangle is reduced. Passage needs to be done without help from the rider. Just slowing trot.
- -Half-pass: Abort unless you have a wonderful, perfect bend at the start. It will not get better. Must have bending and flexing before going sideways.
- -Walk pirouette: start from half-pass nice prep.
- -In tempi changes you need to sit back and half-halt, and not lean forward. Otherwise the horse's fore-hand is weighted and this makes the change harder.

Exercises

- Leg yield from long side to qtr line, 10 m circle, LY back to long side
- Ride a 20 m circle in the center of the ring; at B and E, 10 meter circle, adjusting the bend accordingly.

Competition hints

- -Think about what a "10" movement includes. Know the directives for each movement
- -Some movements have nothing to do with the horse's conformation; go for the points on those: reinback, turn on haunches.
- -To get a 10 on canter lengthening: not quicker, ability to do downward transition; need to showcase the down transition. Don't let the lengthening fade before the end of the long side.

All tests are the 2019 USEF Dressage Tests.

All scores from the USDF dressage tests will be reported to USDF for inclusion in the Schooling Show Series Awards. To be considered for an award, you must be an active member in a USDF recognized GMO at the time of the show. Please see the addended set of rules for the USDF schooling show series at the bottom of this prize list. Please provide a copy of your USDF membership verification with your entry if you wish your scores to count.

RULES:

COVID safety guidelines and rules will be in place for everyone's safety.

Show starts at 8:30 A.M.; Ends with the last test ride (RAIN OR SHINE) Indoor dressage ring; warm-up outdoor ring, weather dependent Show is informal; dress code--tidy (braids are optional). ASTM/SEI certified helmet required when mounted.

Ride times will be posted on CDCT's website on Thursday before the show Current Negative Coggins & Rabies Certificate are required – send copy with application.

The stall fee is for a <u>half day only-dependant on the schedule of your rides.</u> We request that you strip your stall before leaving so it can be ready for the next horse coming in. Thank you for your consideration in this matter.

Special leadline class: \$10 (Indicate LEADLINE on entry form: no class number)

Youth (21 and under): half price for all classes

Changes on day of show: \$15 per class. Note: In the event of a test change, your ride times will NOT change. There will be no refunds for changes or cancellations after the closing date, no shows or same day cancellations.

COVID CONSIDERATIONS: We ask your cooperation with the following for the well-being of all and in consideration of this difficult times. We will do our best to keep everyone safe.

- 1. Entries must be RECEIVED by the closing date. Please plan accordingly. If we have to cancel the show for COVID reasons, all entry fees will be refunded. Acts of God (other than plagues or locusts) not refunded. Please mail entries on time. No exceptions on this.
- 2. We will not have an in-person office. A manager will be on the show grounds at all times to answer questions and address concerns, but check in will be self-service. For this reason, you must be paid in full and have all necessary paperwork before you will be allowed to unload your horse. Your tests will be scored and your awards mailed to you at the end of the show. Indicate preferred mailing address on entry. Results will be posted the same day on our Facebook page and within a few days on our webpage. We will do our best to personally phone or text all competitors with results as a courtesy in these strange times.
- 3. All persons on the show grounds must wear a mask or face shield at all times unless mounted or outside and at least six feet from other participants. We ask that you not make management police this. If you have a medical dispensation that prohibits you from using a mask, please bring a face shield. If you can wear neither a mask nor a face shield when unmounted, we ask that you refrain from coming to our show this year and join us when things are more stable.
- 4. When not on your horse, please maintain social distance from other competitors and any spectators. Assume everyone else is a boss mare and you are but a shy gelding and keep your distance.
- 5. We will be limiting the number of riders on the grounds. We will have morning groups (two to three sets) and afternoon groups. (two to three sets) You may ask to be grouped with friends on your entry so that you can enjoy the show together. We ask that you not show up at the show grounds more than two hours before your first ride or that of a person in your group if trailering together. We ask that if possible, you exit the show after your rides are finished so that we can keep the number of participants low.
- 6. Tests will not necessarily be ridden sequentially. If you are coming with a group of friends, we will try to group all of your rides together, regardless of level. Riders will have at least two test rides, but not more than four, between their rides. There will be no more than five horses in the warm-up ring at any time.

- 7. We ask that you limit the number of spectators who might come with you to **one or two per rider.** Spectators agree to be bound by social distancing and mask/face shield rules and agree to all our guidelines for a safe show. All chairs must be at least six feet apart.
- 8. Please bring your own refreshments as none will be provided this year unless deemed infeasible by management. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or change the timing of classes as deemed necessary for the smooth running of the show.

Total number of tests cannot exceed three.

High Score Awards: High Score Youth Under 14, High Score Youth 14-21, High Score of Show, Youth Sportsmanship Award (for youth competitor showing exceptional character in their care of their horse and treatment of other competitors), Level Champion and Reserve Level Champion (if level has more than five entries).

Special Awards: (provided by club members) Youngest Rider to Enter at A; Norwegian Fjord etc. Horse; additional prizes to be announced.

Vaccines: All competitors are required to provide proof of a Rabies vaccination, EHV/Flu-Rhino and negative Coggins to compete in this show.

Please do not bring your dogs. PLEASE, NO DOGS.

Limited stalls are available. There is ample space to show off your trailer at this show. Grounds are quiet and safe.

Ride times: Times will be posted on our club website www.cayugadressage.org within three days of the show. Management reserves the right to change ride times until the morning of the show in the event of unforeseen weather events. No refunds for Acts of God cancellation.

General Information & Links

To encourage the retraining of Thoroughbreds into other disciplines upon completion of careers in racing or breeding, The Jockey Club created the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.). T.I.P. has a number of programs geared toward all riders and Thoroughbreds. Generally, all information on T.I.P. programs can be found on our website (tictip.com) under "TB Owners & Riders".

<u>Eligibility</u> - For purposes of eligibility for all T.I.P. classes and awards, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. Unregistered horses are not eligible.

<u>T.I.P. Numbers -</u> To participate in T.I.P., owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number. To apply for a T.I.P. number, please visit <u>tjctip.com</u> and click on "My Account". You will need an Interactive Registration™ account to apply for a T.I.P. Number. Interactive Registration™ is a FREE service designed for the use of thoroughbred owners and breeders to transact business electronically with The Jockey Club registry. T.I.P. Numbers are free. The T.I.P. number card should be provided to participating horse shows as proof of eligibility.

- > T.I.P. Numbers are horse/owner specific. If you purchase a horse with a number, you need to get a new T.I.P. Number for the horse under your own account.
- All riders must be listed on the T.I.P. Number to add a rider, log into your account and click "Add Rider"

<u>Horse Show Awards</u> – T.I.P. offers sponsorship of Thoroughbred classes and high point awards at approved horse shows in virtually all disciplines, including hunter/jumper, eventing, dressage, Western, polo, polocrosse, and endurance.

<u>Performance Awards</u> – The Performance Awards are T.I.P.'s year end, self-reported Thoroughbred "points program". The Performance Awards are completely self-reported by the Thoroughbred's owner or rider. The Award Year is December 1 - November 30 and all forms are due December 20.

<u>Recreational Riding Program</u> – The Thoroughbred Recreational Riding Incentive Program (TRRIP) is designed to recognize and reward Thoroughbred owners and riders that enjoy recreational riding or driving on a regular basis. There are prizes associated with each hour level, beginning with 25 hours.

<u>Championships</u> –The Jockey Club hosts an all Thoroughbred Championship Horse Show with championship divisions for Hunters, Jumpers, English Pleasure, Dressage and Western Pleasure. T.I.P. offers championship awards for eventing at the United States Eventing Association's American Eventing Championships.

<u>Young Rider and Non-Competition Programs</u> – T.I.P. offers a Young Rider of the Year Award and a Youth Ambassador Program as well as a Thoroughbred of the Year Award which recognizes a Thoroughbred that has excelled in a non-competitive career, such as equine-assisted therapy or police work.


