WHAT I LEARNED AFTER A 20 YEAR HIATUS FROM COMPETING IN A RECOGNIZED HORSE TRIALS

On July 9th and 10th I competed Sunny at the Genesee valley Hunt horse trials. We had done two unrecognized events last year but this was our first recognized event and my first in 20 years. For those of you that remember Brio, my last recognized event was with his mother, Dee. The following is a few words of wisdom to myself and reflections on the weekend.

- 1. Always bring a trusted friend with you.
- 2. The nice forward horse you had warming up in a field for dressage is not the same horse you're going to get in the sandbox.
- 3. Most of the other competitors will look at least 20 years younger than you.
- 4. But you can look forward to your fellow competitors being super friendly and supportive.
- 5. It's probably a good idea to work your horse at home at least a little bit at the same speed you'll be going out in cross country.
- 6. As you can see from the attached photo, next time I'll tighten my girth another hole or two and use my saddle pad keepers
- 7. Go for a good gallop around the warmth area before doing your stadium test.
- 8. You're only going to use half the things you brought for your overnight stabling but bring it all anyway.

Although we only went Intro which was about a mile and a half at 300 meters per minute Sunny the proverbial couch potato could have been a bit fitter. He gladly would have walked after we competed 2/3 of the course but he tried his heart out, cleared all 12 fences and cantered to the end with me never once needing to use my jumping bat.

All in all we ended up 5th with cross country time penalties :-) and the satisfaction of knowing we finished!

Participating competitions must submit a copy of their prize list to USDF no later than 14 days prior to the competition and competition results must be submitted to USDF within 21 days of the end date of the competition.
