RULES

Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or change the order of classes as deemed necessary.

The show will begin at 8:30 AM and will end after the last test is ridden.

Dressage tests will be ridden in a large size (20m x 60m) dressage arena and a separate warmup ring will be available for schooling, with one ring being in an outdoor, uncovered arena. The Introductory classes may run in a small arena (20m x 40m). The Prix Caprilli classes will be the final classes of the day in order to minimize jump setup and teardown.

The show is an informal schooling show. The dress code is neat and tidy, braids are optional. ASTM/SEI Certified helmets are required when mounted.

Class fees are listed in the table below and are dependent on CDCT membership status. Join today and save on entry fees! www.cayugadressage.org/membership

Entries must be RECEIVED by the closing date. "Acts of God" will not be refunded. There will be NO refunds for individual changes or cancellations after the closing date, no exceptions.

All fees must be paid in full and all necessary paperwork must be submitted PRIOR to arriving to the show grounds. Upon arrival, please check in to receive your number. Scoring will be tabulated as quickly as possible and ribbons and tests will be set out for pick up. Results will be posted on our Facebook and website following the end of the show.

A limited number of day stalls are available on-site for \$25/stall. No tack stalls are available. Overnight stalls are available for \$30/stall and are located 2.8 miles down the road at 451 Sheffield Road (access via Iradell Road NOT Hayts). All stalls must be stripped at the end of the day. Shavings not provided. Please indicate if you want overnight stabling on your entry form. Water will be available for horses showing out of their trailers.

Tests may be ridden out of sequential order. Riders will have at least two tests break between rides. There will be no more than five horses in the warm-up ring at any time. In the event of a test change after the closing date, your ride times will remain the same regardless of tests chosen. Ride times will be posted on the CDCT website at least three days prior to the show date - www.cayugadressage.org. There is a class change fee of \$15 after the closing date.

If riding in a Test of Choice (TOC) class, please be sure to indicate which test you want to ride on your entry form. Prix Caprilli tests can be found on our website under the Forms section. Musical Freestyles must be provided on a USB flash drive.

Total number of tests ridden cannot exceed three with the exception of Leadline and Dressage Seat Eq.

No dogs allowed. No glass bottles allowed.

All competitors are required to provide a Negative Coggins and proof of Rabies Vaccine within one year of the show date, and proof of EHV/EIV Vaccination within six months of the show date with your entry form. The Strangles Vaccine is highly recommended but not required.

Thoroughbred Incentive Program

General Information & Links

To encourage the retraining of Thoroughbreds into other disciplines upon completion of careers in racing or breeding, The Jockey Club created the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.). T.I.P. has a number of programs geared toward all riders and Thoroughbreds. Generally, all information on T.I.P. programs can be found on our website (tjctip.com) under "TB Owners & Riders".

Eligibility - For purposes of eligibility for all T.I.P. classes and awards, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. Unregistered horses are not eligible.

T.I.P. Numbers - To participate in T.I.P., owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number. To apply for a T.I.P. number, please visit tjctip.com and click on "My Account". You will need an Interactive Registration™ account to apply for a T.I.P. Number. Interactive Registration™ is a FREE service designed for the use of thoroughbred owners and breeders to transact business electronically with The Jockey Club registry. T.I.P. Numbers are free. The T.I.P. number card should be provided to participating horse shows as proof of eligibility.

- T.I.P. Numbers are horse/owner specific. If you purchase a horse with a number, you need to get a new T.I.P. Number for the horse under your own account.
- All riders must be listed on the T.I.P. Number – to add a rider, log into your account and click "Add Rider"

Horse Show Awards – T.I.P. offers sponsorship of Thoroughbred classes and high point awards at approved horse shows in virtually all disciplines, including hunter/jumper, eventing, dressage, Western, polo, polocrosse, and endurance.

Performance Awards – The Performance Awards are T.I.P.'s year end, self-reported Thoroughbred "points program". The Performance Awards are completely self-reported by the Thoroughbred's owner or rider. The Award Year is December 1 - November 30 and all forms are due December 20.

Recreational Riding Program – The Thoroughbred Recreational Riding Incentive Program (TRRIP) is designed to recognize and reward Thoroughbred owners and riders that enjoy recreational riding or driving on a regular basis. There are prizes associated with each hour level, beginning with 25 hours.

Championships – The Jockey Club hosts an all Thoroughbred Championship Horse Show with championship divisions for Hunters, Jumpers, English Pleasure, Dressage and Western Pleasure. T.I.P. offers championship awards for eventing at the United States Eventing Association's American Eventing Championships.

Young Rider and Non-Competition Programs – T.I.P. offers a Young Rider of the Year Award and a Youth Ambassador Program as well as a Thoroughbred of the Year Award which recognizes a Thoroughbred that has excelled in a non-competitive career, such as equine-assisted therapy or police work.

THIS DOCUMENT IS A LEGALLY BINDING INSTRUMENT, PLEASE READ IT THOROUGHLY, REFUSE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ACTIVITIES AND CONSULT WITH AN ATTORNEY IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS AS TO ITS CONTENTS.

In consideration of being permitted to use the facilities, participate in or observe activities, and to receive instruction on horseback riding, horse care and stable usage at the Ithaca Equestrian Center, LLC operations and premises, the undersigned:

1. Acknowledges and fully understands that Ithaca Equestrian Center, LLC is the owner and operator of an Agricultural Tourism Area as defined under New York's General Obligation Law. And that pursuant to Article 18B of New York's General Obligation Law, the Ithaca Equestrian Center shall not be Liable for death or injury while on the premises. In accordance with New York Law, the Ithaca Equestrian Center has provided me with certain notices regarding the risks inherent in visiting and using the Equestrian Center and my obligations as a visitor or participant.
2. Acknowledges receipt of the **WARNING TO VISITORS** document (attached as Page 3) and the **VISITOR & CLIENT RESPONSIBILITY NOTICE** (attached as Page 4).
3. . Has read and understands the notices regarding the risks inherent in equine activities and the obligations of visitors and participants. Understands that being on the premises of the Ithaca Equestrian Center exposes visitors and participants to these risks as well as unforeseeable risks that can result in injury or death to people and animals.
4. Agrees that if signing on behalf of a minor, that I am the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of such minor and that I fully understand the risks and have made the informed decision to permit the minor to visit the Ithaca Equestrian Center to observe or participate in the activities offered by the Equestrian Center.
5. Agrees that I have instructed the minor regarding his/her responsibilities as a visitor to the Equestrian Center, as well as instructed the minor regarding the contents of the written notices and warnings located at the facility, including the locations of any written warnings located at the facility, and the contents of the Equestrian Center's Rules and Regulations.
6. Assumes all the inherent risks and accepts personal responsibility for the dangers, fully knowing that they may result in injury, permanent disability, or death.
7. Agrees to release, waive, discharge and covenants not to sue Ithaca Equestrian Center, LLC, its owners, officers, directors, agents or independent contractors, employees, other participants all of which are hereinafter referred to as "releasees" from liability to each of the undersigned, his/her heirs and next of kin for claims demands, losses or damages on account of injury, including death, to myself or my horse or property damage caused or alleged to be caused in whole or in part by the negligence of the releasee or otherwise.
8. Agrees that by entering or observing an event or activity on the premises I consent to being photographed and/or videoed and waive all rights to photographs/videos taken by an Ithaca Equestrian Center, LLC staff, professional photographer, or personal photos by other participants.
9. Agrees that this release shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York, without giving effect to conflict of laws. I hereby consent to personal jurisdiction of the State and Federal Courts located in Tompkins County and the Northern District of New York for any and all claims arising under or related to this release. Every provision of this release is intended to be severable. If any provision of this release, or

the application of such provision to any circumstance, is declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the remaining provisions of this release or the application of such provisions to circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid or unenforceable.
