So, back to this morning's workouts. The bluebirds being there was uplifting and things just seemed to be getting better as we went. Left-side flexions seemed to be easier than last week, GG is seeking the bit and carrying herself more and more and our canter transitions are getting more subtle. Amara has the straightest leg-yields and is also starting to reveal the possibility of the topline we've been working on all summer. Steering remains an issue at times and she only occasionally responds to my seat, but that is progress, nonetheless. I am learning a lot from the differences the two mares present while schooling and its getting more fun as time goes on.



At my age I have been anxious to get moving up the levels with GG Marquez. I now can say that the COVID era has been a gift for us in a way. We have ridden all three first level tests in

three schooling shows this season and that has clearly been a "shakedown" for us. Up until now I felt I could do one of two things while riding a test: I could remember the test and execute it correctly or I could actually ride the test. I think of it as the same thing as acting; one is either reciting memorized lines or, one is actually present, acting in the moment, negotiating what is actually going on in that moment, responding as one goes and trusting the lines will come because they make sense in the context of the moment - and - you have memorized them completely. So, the biggest victory for the season has been to move into a phase where I can actively ride the test and begin to relax around the idea that the sequence will not simply vacate my head if anything else happens to cross my mind. We have quite a few elements to work on together, but I am already hungry and optimistic for the 2021 season!

Recently many club members did manage to be in person, in one place, in a way, for the first time this summer! I wish to congratulate all the folks who worked on the Keeping It Casual show held at Fortress Farm on August 23rd. Jane Marie, Tina, Skye-Anna, Kathy, Dinah, Carol, Karen, Emily, Connie, Lorrie, and I am sure I have left someone out, all did a fantastic job of keeping us all COVID-safe, on schedule and coming and going with relative ease. Mary Reynolds gets a special shout-out for inviting CDCT back to her beautiful farm. Where else can you compete in an arena bordered by a manicured hedge, among other things?
