Office Fee: \$20 for CDCT members;

Changes on day of show: \$15 per class. Note: In the event of a test change, your ride times will NOT change. There will be no refunds for changes or cancellations after the closing date, no shows or same day cancellations.

COVID CONSIDERATIONS: We ask your cooperation with the following for the well-being of all and in consideration of this difficult times. We will do our best to keep everyone safe.

1. Entries must be RECEIVED by the closing date. Please plan accordingly. If we have to cancel the show for COVID reasons, all entry fees will be refunded. Acts of God (other than plagues or locusts) not refunded. Please mail entries on time. No exceptions on this.
2. There is no stabling at all for this show. We will have safe parking for all trailers.
3. We will not have an in-person office. A manager will be on the show grounds at all times to answer questions and address concerns, but check in will be self-service. For this reason, you must be paid in full and have all necessary paperwork before you will be allowed to unload your horse. Your tests will be scored and your awards mailed to you at the end of the show. Indicate preferred mailing address on entry. Results will be posted the same day on our Facebook page and within a few days on our webpage. We will do our best to personally phone or text all competitors with results as a courtesy in these strange times.
4. All persons on the show grounds must wear a mask or face shield at all times unless mounted or outside and at least six feet from other participants. We ask that you not make management police this. If you have a medical dispensation that prohibits you from using a mask, please bring a face shield. If you can wear neither a mask nor a face shield when unmounted, we ask that you refrain from coming to our show this year and join us when things are more stable.
5. When not on your horse, please maintain social distance from other competitors and any spectators. Assume everyone else is a boss mare and you are but a shy gelding and keep your distance.
6. We will be limiting the number of riders on the grounds. We will have morning groups (two to three sets) and afternoon groups. (two to three sets) You may ask to be grouped with friends on your entry so that you can enjoy the show together. We ask that you not show up at the show grounds more than two hours before your first ride or that of a person in your group if trailering together. We ask that if possible, you exit the show after your rides are finished so that we can keep the number of participants low.
7. Tests will not necessarily be ridden sequentially. If you are coming with a group of friends, we will try to group all of your rides together, regardless of level. Riders will have at least two test rides, but not more than four, between their rides. There will be no more than five horses in the warm-up ring at any time.
8. We ask that you limit the number of spectators who might come with you to one or two per rider. Spectators agree to be bound by social distancing and mask/face shield rules and agree to all our guidelines for a safe show. All chairs must be at least six feet apart.
9. Please bring your own refreshments as none will be provided this year.
10. Please specify JR/YR, Adult Amateur, or Open. Adults and youth will be pinned separately unless deemed infeasible by management. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or change the timing of classes as deemed necessary for the smooth running of the show. All tests are the 2019 USEF Dressage Tests. Youth competitors who are under the age of 18 must have the written consent of a legal guardian.

Closing Date: (received by) August 16, 2020

All scores from the USDF dressage tests will be reported to USDF for inclusion in the Schooling Show Series Awards. To be considered for an award, you must be an active member in a USDF recognized GMO at the time of the show. Please see the addended set of rules for the USDF schooling show series at the bottom of this prize list. **Please provide a copy of your USDF membership verification with your entry if you wish your scores to count.**

High Score Awards: High Score Youth Under 14, High Score Youth 14-21, High Score of Show, Youth Sportsmanship Award (for youth competitor showing exceptional character in their care of their horse and treatment of other competitors), Level Champion and Reserve Level Champion (if level has more than five entries).

Special Awards :(provided by club members) Youngest Rider to Enter at A; Norwegian Fjord Horse; additional prizes to be announced.

Vaccines: All competitors are required to provide proof of a Rabies vaccination, EHV/Flu-Rhino and negative Coggins to compete in this show. Please do not bring your dogs. **PLEASE, NO DOGS.**

No stabling available There is ample space to show off your trailer at this show. Grounds are quiet and safe. No stabling is available. No day stalls for the show.

Ride times: Times will be posted on our club website www.cayugadressage.org within three days of the show. Management reserves the right to change ride times until the morning of the show in the event of unforeseen weather events. No refunds for Acts of God cancellation.

Regional Schooling Show Awards Program Rules

General Information:

1. Program year is December 1 through November 30.
2. Scores may be earned in any USDF region.
3. Late nominations, applications and results submissions will not be accepted.

Rider Eligibility & Requirements:

1. Rider must have a USDF Group Membership that is recorded by the Group Member Organization (GMO) at the time the scores are earned.
2. Riders affiliated with an International GMO must declare a USDF region.
3. Owner must have at least a USDF non-member number at the time the scores are earned.
4. Horse must have at least a USDF Horse Identification Number at the time the scores are earned.
5. Rider must submit a one-time yearly online nomination and \$35 nomination fee for each horse/rider combination no later than 14 days after the last day of the first competition. The nomination fee must be paid annually.
6. Riders may change their division status during the program year. A rider's status will be determined at the end of the program year.
7. Rider must submit scores to USDF online no later than 21 days after the last day of the competition.
8. Only USDF members in good standing are eligible to compete in the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program and receive awards.

Award Divisions & Levels:

1. Four award divisions will be recognized per region:
 - a. Open: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a USEF Adult Amateur (AA), not a non-professional.
 - b. Junior/Young Rider (Jr/YR): up until the end of the calendar year the rider reaches age 21.
 - c. AA: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22 and possess a current USEF AA card.
 - d. Non-Professional: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a current USEF AA, not a professional.
2. Seven levels (freestyle, pas de deux and quadrille not included) will be recognized per division. Exception: only 6 levels are recognized in the open division:
 - a. Introductory (only in Jr/YR, AA and non-professional divisions)
 - b. Training
 - c. First
 - d. Second
 - e. Third
 - f. Fourth
 - g. FEI – combination of Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II and Grand Prix scores.

3. Equivalencies listed in the current *USDF Member Guide* are eligible. Tests not listed as equivalencies will not be eligible.
4. Preliminary standings will be ranked using a median of all eligible scores and will be available on the USDF website.
5. Final awards standings will be based on the rider's region of primary residence in the USDF database as of November 30.

Score requirements:

1. Introductory Level:
 - a. Must have a minimum of five scores
 - b. From three different judges
 - c. From three different competitions
2. Training through Fourth Levels (levels may not be combined to meet requirements):
 - a. Must have a minimum of five scores
 - b. From three different judges
 - c. From three different competitions
 - d. At least one score must be earned from the highest test of the level
3. FEI Level (levels may be combined to meet requirements):
 - a. Must have a minimum of four scores
 - b. From three different judges
 - c. From three different competitions

Prizes:

1. Up to ten placings per division/level will be recognized.
2. Ribbons will be mailed to the rider.
3. Certificates will be available online.

Competition Management Requirements:

1. Any non-USEF-licensed/non-USDF-recognized competition may participate.
2. To participate, competition management must submit online application and \$25 participation fee to USDF at least 30 days prior to the start date of the competition.
3. The prize list must be submitted to USDF no later than 14 days prior to the competition.
4. Competition judges must be one of the following:
 - a. Current USDF L Graduate, with or without distinction (highly recommend USDF L Graduates with distinction), which has met USDF continuing education requirements and Safe Sport training. USDF L Graduates with distinction are eligible to judge FEI classes.
 - b. USEF or FEI-licensed or retired dressage judge.
5. FEI classes must be judged by USEF or FEI-licensed or retired dressage judges or USDF L Graduates with distinction.
6. Competition arenas must be in compliance with US Equestrian DR 126 for level 1 competitions.
7. Competition results must be submitted to USDF via the USDF Electronic Results Submission Standard (ERSS) format (using the USEF Universal Spreadsheet Template) no later than 21 days from the end date of the competition.

Announcement: The Dressage at State Fair Show, organized by CNYDCTA, has been cancelled due to Covid.

Treasurer's Report: Ginny reported the balances for the Youth Fund, Awards Fund, Checking account, and CD. Balances for the checking account are low because we were unable to run our recognized show, which is our major fundraiser. Dollars in the Awards Fund have already been allocated, but not spent.

By-Laws Sub-committee report: Norm reviewed the major changes. The revision will be presented to the entire Board in the coming months, and will be voted on by the entire membership at the Annual Meeting in November. Jane-Marie and Prin will draft a "Best Practices" manual outlining how the club and its activities are run. This document will be shared amongst the Board via Google Docs (or similar means) for input from those involved in running shows, clinics, and other activities.

Open Zoom meeting: Prin suggested that we have a Zoom meeting open to the entire membership at least twice a year (N.B. all meetings are open to all members. Fall Symposium with Lisa el-Ramey has been postponed due to quarantine requirements for people traveling from Florida to NY. Jane-Marie will notify USDF. The grant should carry over to next year.

Kathy Thode will be Volunteer Coordinator
