Approval of Minutes: Motion made by K. Thode, seconded by K. Garnsey to approve minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report: Checking-\$645, savings- \$986, Footing fund-\$1213.58, CD-\$7737. G. Grove made a recommendation to move the footing fund to our checking account as our funds are down at present and we have bills to pay in order to have the shows this summer. S. Mulvey made a motion to move this money, seconded by M. DeTuri. Motion carried by the board.

Committee Reports:

Dressage: Schooling/ Recognized show (June 21-22, 2014)- Two judges have been hired: Margaret Boyce and Nancy Harris. It was recommended that Donna get a contract from J. Ritchie. We will give \$50 to join AQHA in hopes of drawing some Quarter horse riders to use points gained at our show for their year-end awards. We will not be able to sponsor the TDF this year for our show due to finances. Also we will hold on purchasing the arena from CNYCTA. D. Guarino contacted N. Pelham regarding setting up our arenas and putting them away. He has not returned a call if he will be able to do this.

Sponsorship- K. Thode will post the form in the next newsletter. Members are encouraged to solicit sponsors to improve our finances to put on the show.

Casual Show- Deferred for now.

Education Committee- Musical Freestyle clinic: we now have 5 riders for freestyles and 2 separate lessons. The Dressage Foundation awarded us \$150. D. Young will give us a lecture at the April meeting. Other suggestions by the committee included a talk by C. Glennister on fly mgmt., streaming dressage instruction on the USEF channel. M. DeTuri suggested that we might have a bling browband and stockpin session where we decorate these items. She also suggested that we might have a wine tasting and shopping day possibly in the fall. Yoga was also a suggestion for the Fall.

Awards committee- Nothing new at this time. K. Steffy, M. Blade, C. Morris and G. Grove to meet to discuss volunteer awards.

By-laws update- K. Garnsey and D. Moose will review and work on term limits for Officers and Board members.

Publicity- S. Su and K. Thode reviewed the lists of places the Freestyle clinic has been advertised.

Combined Training and Jr. Young Riders- K. Potter not present to give a report.

New Business- M. DeTuri passed out t-shirt styles and logos we could have printed on them. These could be for volunteers at the show as well as for sale. Attendees voted on the styles and logo choices. She will bring pictures and samples. K. Garnsey gave a brief synopsis of the book "The Inner Game of Tennis" by W. Timothy Gallwey. This book deals with the psychology of sports and how we can summon relaxed concentration and apply it to riding.

MUSICAL FREESTYLE WITH ANN GUPTILL

With the exception of Old Man Winter hanging around for the weekend of the clinic, the freestyle clinic was a raging success for both auditors and participants.

Ann Guptill arrived at Brookside Farm in Moravia laden with a bag full of CD's along with lots of ideas for choreography for creating freestyles for our horses. The first day was spent finding the tempos for each of our horses, and then trying several pieces of music to match tempos for walk, trot and canter. Some riders had jotted down ideas for their choreography. Ann perused these and made suggestions, corrections or alterations. Rider and horse levels ranged from Training Level to Intermediaire One. This allowed both riders and auditors to see the process across the levels, putting in all the compulsory moves required for the particular level.

Comments from riders and auditors were very positive. "Ann Guptill made the process of creating a freestyle manageable by chunking the pieces and putting together the pieces". Another one noted "Ann Guptill was very organized, pleasant, and put the creating of a freestyle into stages that allowed me to understand the purpose more clearly. She was very creative in her ideas for new movements".

"Ann was excellent at showing us how music can be enjoyed by both the rider and the horse. As each rider "tested" different music, she pointed out the tempos of the horses' gaits and how the rider influenced the tempo when ridden to different music. Sometimes the rider was asking the horse to slow it's tempo or quicken it's tempo depending on the music. Ann easily identified the strengths and weaknesses of the horse and rider, and skillfully recommended movements and music to show the best of both."

The only negative comments were related to the weather. In the future, we could try to barter with Mother Nature for some tamer weather.

In conclusion, I think we can expect to see more freestyles performed at our future shows. Riders are already organizing for a place and time to practice our choreography in a full size arena, and videotaping in order to put our music to the ride.

General Information

GAIG/USDF QUALIFYING - GAIG/USDF Qualifying Classes, rider and owner must be a USEF member (Junior, Senior or Life); horse must be lifetime registered/recorded with USDF and USEF, rider must be an USDF participating member, and owner must be a USDF participating or business member.

FREESTYLE CLASSES – Copy of your qualifying test score must be included with entry.

OPPORTUNITY CLASSES – No memberships or federation fees required for participant or horse unless riding in other recognized classes.

AWARDS - First place prize awarded and ribbons to 6th place. Championship and Reserve Championship will be awarded at each level with 3 or more riders

FOOTING AND ARENAS - Competition arenas and warm up arena are blue stone. Training Level tests may be ridden in a small arena; all other tests will be ridden in a large arena.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION - USDF Horse ID or Horse Lifetime Registration number is required. Include copies of your USDF Horse Registration or HID card. If you do not have a USDF HID or Registration, you will be required to buy either a USDF Lifetime Horse ID or Lifetime Horse Registration. If you have a USDF HID or Lifetime Registration number but cannot provide proof, you will be required to fill out a USDF affidavit and pay an additional \$5.00 fee before you are allowed to compete.

ENTRIES: Entry forms can be found at www.CayugaDressage.org. Entries will not be accepted without a copy of Negative Coggins Test valid within two years of the show and a copy of a Rabies certificate (signed by a veterinarian, valid within one year of competition date). For rider, owner, trainer, (& coach if applicable), and horse include copies of your USEF membership cards, proof of USDF membership or nonmember ID, USDF Horse ID/Registration, and if GAIG/USDF Qualifying, USEF Lifetime Horse Recording, a completed and signed entry form, and all fees. Incomplete entries, i.e., those missing required documents will be charged \$10. Class changes after the closing date will cost \$10.00 per change.

REFUNDS: Refunds will be given for cancellations received in writing before the closing date less a \$20.00 office fee. If for any reason a class(es) or an entire day(s) needs to be canceled due to an act of God, national tragedy, or any other reason, no refunds will be made. Refunds after Closing Date ONLY with documented proof from a Medical or Veterinary doctor showing cause as to why the competitor should be excused; \$20 Office fee will apply. Changes to entries after the Closing Date will be charged an additional \$10.00. Non-compete horses require a signed entry blank, current Coggins and rabies forms and \$20 office fee.

POST ENTRIES will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis if space is available. Classes entered after the closing date will cost an additional \$10.00 per class. Incomplete entries, i.e., those missing required documents will be charged \$10. Class changes after the closing date will cost \$10.00 per change.

PAYMENT: MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE to: Cayuga Dressage & Combined Training, Inc. and mail with entry form to the Secretary. Checks with insufficient funds will be accessed at \$30 service fee.

TIMES & ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS Tentative times may be obtained via the Internet: <http://www.cayugadressage.org> as well as www.FoxVillage.com. Times will be available 3 days before the show. If you do not have access to the Internet, contact the Show Secretary to obtain your times.

STABLING - Permanent wooden stalls 10' x 10' w/full doors for horses and tack (subject to availability) are available on the grounds Saturday for \$30.00 per day or Sunday for \$40 a day, \$70 weekend. Bedding is not provided but available to buy. Show horses have stabling preference over non-compete horses.

SERVICES: Medical personnel will be on the grounds during the show; a farrier will be on the grounds during the show and veterinarian (posted at show office) will be on call. Phone numbers will be posted in the barn area and at the secretary's stand.

REFRESHMENTS: Available at site.
