MASTERTSON METHOD WEEKEND SEMINAR WITH JULIE STEORTS

Masterson Method is a soft touch integrated bodywork methodology that releases tension in the horse. It is nationally and internationally recognized and requires a very thorough course load and mentorship program in order for anyone to achieve certification. Does this sound familiar? Well maybe you read my article in our February newsletter about attending an Introduction to Masterson Method Clinic at Healing Rein Farm in January of this year. This past month, I was able to complete the Masterson Method Weekend Seminar, also at Healing Rein Farm, which is the first step towards becoming certified.



After the Weekend Seminar, the next step towards certification is a Home Study Course and then an Advanced Five-Day Course. We had two wonderful people helping out who completed the Five-Day Course earlier this year and they couldn't say enough great things about it. You get to spend five days traveling to barns from different disciplines practicing Masterson Method and learning new techniques. After the Advanced Course, there are three Fieldwork Blocks with mentorship and case studies, and an Anatomy Course to complete. The program lets you go as far as you want, even if you don't want to become certified in the end. It sets you up for success and really strives to help facilitate the best learning and practices possible.

Our Weekend Seminar was comprised of two full days of hands-on learning under instruction from the incredible Julie Steorts. Julie is a Masterson Method Certified Practitioner (MMCP) from Arizona who teaches seminars, offers Masterson Method services, and cannot say enough good things about using Masterson on a number of rehab horses in her care throughout the years. She was very enthusiastic, thorough, quick to congratulate successes, and just an overall blast to be around. We were also fortunate to have three wonderful MMCP's on hand to assist all the students, Fredericka Warren (NY), Bernadette Bos (NY), and Devan DeStefano (NJ).

The prerequisite for attending the Weekend Seminar was to have read *Beyond Horse Massage*, the first book on Masterson Method that outlines a number of the techniques. The horses used for the weekend encompassed many breeds and sizes including draft crosses, thoroughbreds, minis, arabians, quarter horses, icelandics, and warmbloods, ranging from 5 years old up to 30! They also spanned a range of disciplines, having performed in hunter/jumpers, dressage, fox hunting, barrels, trail riding, western pleasure, and more. It was a real treat to be able to compare and contrast so many truly unique horses and assess how the bodywork helped them.

Saturday after check-in and introductions, we set off to work on Bladder Meridian and a number of other front end techniques. We got to watch Julie demonstrate everything and then worked in groups of two with a horse to try them out. We also got to switch horses so we were able to see how the techniques worked on a variety of shapes and sizes. Sunday morning we learned how to perform all the hind end techniques before spending the afternoon putting everything together and working on a fresh batch of horses, start to finish.

Having read the book, it was very refreshing to see the techniques performed in real-life while also being able to have instant feedback on my position and pressures. Sometimes translating text into actions is a challenge so being able to get help was really fabulous. I also observed every horse (6 in a session) come into the arena a little nervous, fidgety, and tense, and within minutes, relax, yawn, lick, chew, and really limber up. The first horse I worked with, a beautiful 27 year old thoroughbred mare, came in and just wanted to circle circle circle. After a few techniques were performed she was almost melting into the floor. Seriously, Sunday she came into the arena, picked a spot, and basically fell asleep because she was so relaxed. We also got to see a young horse who relaxed but wouldn't allow anything to be done to his hind end. Being able to listen and interpret what the horse is saying is an equally important lesson so I really appreciated a few instances of "what would you do if that happened?"

Overall it was a fabulous learning experience and gave me a lot of tools and confidence to help my own horses. I cannot thank Colleen Price enough for not only hosting and welcoming us all but also cooking delicious food all weekend. She's the hostess with the mostess and such a wealth of knowledge. Everytime I visit Healing Rein Farm, I'm blown away with the care, the atmosphere, and the amount of amazing people it brings together. I'm excited to continue my Masterson Method learning journey after such an informative, productive weekend. It's a fabulous modality and I just want to learn more!
