

Treasurers Report: Braiding Clinic deposits \$140, Raffle \$20, Bake Sale \$25

President's Report:

Committees please add Norm to all communications as he is an Ad Hoc member of all. Bylaw revisions and comparisons to USDF bylaws. Will be sent to Board when completed.

Old Business:

Cat Hill Braiding Clinic: 7 Attended. Excellent instruction. Suggest better accounting for attendance and financial commitment in advance. Difficult to plan for equipment etc without accurate numbers.

Cat Hill is not available for the July date for Eventing Clinic. Norm will contact Carriage House to release the date. Eventing Clinic Committee will meet with Ms. Hill to determine minimum attendance required and find an available dates (2 days). It is possible to use Eventingclinics.com to manage registrations and potentially online payment. Committee will complete the CDCTA Clinic Form. Will consider youth incentive but will need to include adult riders to cover expenses. Insurance will be \$38 per day. Not intended to be a fundraiser so entry fee will be to cover costs.



Dressage in Wine Country: Cazenovia has made arrangements should the Novel CoVID 19 be a concern for travel. THROWBACK CLINIC NOTES

George Williams, October 9,2011 By Karen Steffy

- The warmup creates looseness, the work creates expression
- Stretching at the trot at the end of work can be "less exciting"
- If the horse is stuck in the neck, it creates a dam in the flow of energy from the hind legs
- Ride serpentines with enlarging before the long side
- With the horse bent to the induced, large the circle using the inside leg, can support with the outside rein
- The outside rein controls longitudinal flexion, the inside controls lateral flexion
- When a horse is bent to the inside, you need to feel as if the ribs are bent
- The warm up should be quiet and on the boring side
- When riding figure 8s, introduce the new bend one stride before the CL
- When the horse breaks from canter to trot, stay in trot, get the horse supple and balance before asking for canter again
- Your outside rein can only be as strong as your horse is in front of your inside leg
- You have to provide the steadiness when your horse becomes unsteady
- It's not the end of the world when your horse breaks. It's how you handle it that's crucial.
- Some is probably enough
- If a horse gets tired and muscle sore, he has the right to resist
