

Membership Committee & Communications Open Forum: Held in conjunction with an extended open Membership Committee meeting, the Communications Open Forum will include a USDF staff panel that will give a brief overview of the various USDF communication properties, followed by Q&A session and discussion.

USEF/USDF Open Forum: Trending Topics in Sport & USEF Rule Changes

A joint open forum to discuss the latest trends in dressage, as well as what new rule proposals are being put forward at the upcoming USEF convention.

US Dressage Finals Open Forum

This forum provides a chance for attendees to hear updates and ask questions regarding USDF's premier event.

Competition Open Forum with Q&A

Hear from and discuss various developments in the competition world with competition related USDF committees.

Instructor/Trainer Program Education Session

A professional education session geared towards Judges, Certified Instructors, Instructor/Trainer Program Faculty, L Program Faculty, and L Graduates. L Program Education Session

USEF/USDF Dressage Technical Delegate Clinic and Training Program

Education opportunity for currently licensed dressage technical delegates or individuals accepted into a dressage technical delegate training program.

USEF Athlete Open Forum

A USEF open forum to discuss topics focused on achieving high performance competition levels.

USDF is excited to introduce the new USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. This program starts December 1, 2019 and offers regional recognition to USDF Group Members competing in participating non-USEF-licensed/non-USDF-recognized competitions.

All non-USEF-licensed/non-USDF-recognized competitions are invited to participate in this program. To participate, simply submit the [online application](#) and \$25 participation fee to USDF at least 30 days prior to the start of the competition. The program year will be December 1 through November 30.

An online competition calendar will list participating competitions on the USDF website. Participating competitions must submit a copy of their prize list to USDF no later than 14 days prior to the competition and competition results must be submitted to USDF within 21 days of the end date of the competition.
