Committee reports

June Dressage Shows – June 27- Schooling, June 28- Recognized Dressage Show, Horseheads, NY. Once again the show was well received and attended. Ginny Grove distributed an Income and Expense report for the show. A profit of \$3,941.64 was made after all bills were paid. Problems in running the show were discussed. Research for a new show secretary will begin. Please send any suggestions to Andrea Hopkins.

The date for next years show needs to be firmed up. Donna Young is checking with the Fair Manager. CDCT would like the same weekend. Suggestions were given about different prizes, possibly monetary prizes. However, it was decided that this would not result in an increase in attendance, as most shows give less in prizes or no prizes at all. A BIG thanks to all that acquired sponsorships for the show. It is greatly appreciated by the club!

Chris Hand will check with Gale Wolf to see if the CDCT rings are used for other shows held at the Chemung Co. Fairgrounds.

Casual Show – Dinah Guarino reported – The show will be held at Oxley Equestrian Center at Cornell on August 14th, – Dorothy Maxfield-judge and clinician. Dorothy will be available on the 13th for a lesson/session to help with skills needed to compete. There will be at least 5 overnight stalls available as well as 5 day stalls. At this time there are no entries for clinic. We are offering Prix Caprilli classes. The patterns have already been posted but will be reposted along with more advertising of the event on Facebook. Dinah asked for volunteers and received a large number at the meeting. However, if you wish to volunteer, please contact Dinah. It was pointed out that Ginny has done a great job with the dressage arena at Cornell.

Education – Dr. Richard Card clinic has been canceled due to the inability to meet his desired number of participants. He does come to the area periodically and those that were interested will be informed at that time.

Will Faerber – Art2Ride Clinic – September 17 &18 & 19, location -- Brookside Farm – Katherine Potter is still asking for sponsorship for the clinic. Katherine has worked diligently and is filling all the spots. Katherine will produce a prepared budget to be submitted to the board members for approval. It was brought to the CDCT board's attention some concerns with the previous Art2Ride clinic. These concerns will need to be discussed with the clinician, prior to the next clinic.

USDF Conference- Will be held in St. Louis this year. Anyone that is planning on attending and wishes to represent CDCT as the Delegate, please contact Andrea. There are certain requirements that must be met if the club is to sponsor a participant.

New Business – <u>Awards Committee</u> has come up with the following changes in format of the awards: The "New" awards program should be tried for 2 years and then revisited to see if changes are needed.

Volunteer of the Year — winner gets to choose a Charity to donate money obtained from an equitation class held at our show. Their name will also be submitted to the Region 8 Volunteer of the Year Award

Jr. Young rider award – must apply for - \$125 and jane Marie Law will also donate a book to winner

SPORTSMANship award— Winner to be nominated by the Board and final selection by the Awards Committee. Award valued at around \$75.

Drawing for volunteers at Banquet – Each member who has at least a half day of volunteer hours will have their names put into a drawing for 3/\$100 gift certificates to be used to support their horse habit.

All attendees at Banquet will go home with small gift. A motion to accept the suggestions was made by Carol Morris, 2^{nd} by Kathleen Hefferon

Thinking outside the Sandbox

Somewhere, somehow in the last few weeks I came across the term "Working Equitation", and did what we all do nowadays – I googled it, and, after becoming intrigued, decided to watch a schooling show.

Held at Wind Song Equestrian Center near Hornell, the judge was Carlos Carneiro of Portugal. He had taught a 3 day clinic leading up to the show.

I'm not going to repeat everything I learned from Google (you can do that yourself if you want to). In short, this is a discipline based on the gaucho/vaquero tradition. Competitions include several phases: a dressage test, an obstacle course first ridden for accuracy and then for speed, and at the highest levels, working with cattle.

The dressage tests are ridden at walk and trot at the lower levels, with canter introduced further along. However, some of the requirements, such as ten-meter circles are introduced at the lowest levels, so the horse really needs to know how to bend and work from the seat and leg.

The obstacle course included a variety of elements. There was a pole-bending element, a rope gate to open, pass through, and close, poles to full-pass over in both directions, several elements requiring significant amounts of rein-back, two barrel patterns (a figure eight and a cloverleaf), a wooden bridge, and a small jump. This show did not include any work with cattle, as most of the exhibitors are just learning the sport, although one participant has won at the national level with her Andalusian stallion.

While I have no inclination to turn Mateo into a cow horse, I think it would be fun to play with some of these elements. They are all simple to build (except perhaps for the bridge), so maybe one of these days we can do a fun clinic and play with this concept.
